New Business

A. Public Nuisances

1. Review Chapter 7.06 Nuisances

Mayor and Council reviewed and discussed the meaning of nuisance in chapter 7.06 Nuisances. Attorney Hennessy states from the Black's Law Dictionary the definition of nuisance is a nuisance occurs when a party's action significantly affects, interferes or otherwise negatively impacts another's ability to use and enjoy their own property and which may affect health, safety and welfare.

Some discussion and concern regarding the cost of cleanup could be more than the value of the property. How does the Town pay for the cleanup before then property owner is assessed?

2. Review MCA 75-10-501 Definitions and 75-10-505 Shielding and Removal of Junk Vehicles Generally

Mayor and Council discussed the definition of shielding and removal of Junk Vehicles. Attorney Hennessy clarified if you are running a junk yard then you will need a fence around it and a license from the State of Montana. Mr. Hyatt asked if this pertains to certain zoning like commercial or residential. Mr. Hennessy stated there is no zoning pre-requisites. What classifies as used car sales versus junk

3. Develop procedures and timeline for sending letters to property owners for cleaning up properties.

Mayor and Council discussed a tentative timeline and procedures for sending letters out to the property owners to clean up their lots. The tentative timeline will go as follows:

- In March, the general clean up letter will be sent out.
- Last Saturday in April will be an "inspection" by town council.
- May 15 a letter to the out of compliance property owners will be sent out
- June 1 will start the enforcement
